

# New Grafton Correctional Centre - Enabling works

Temporary road closure - Avenue Road, Lavadia

November 2017

As part of the enabling works for the New Grafton Correctional Centre, a new watermain will be installed across Avenue Road, north of Casuarina Place in Lavadia.

To allow this work to be completed safely and quickly, Avenue Road – 270 metres north of Casuarina Place – will be closed to all traffic on Monday 13 November between 9am and 3pm, weather permitting.

A detour route will be in place for all traffic during this period, and the detour routes are described below:

- All traffic north of the closure will be diverted via Avenue Road northbound, Deep Creek Road and Coldstream Road
- All traffic south of the closure will be diverted via Avenue Road southbound, Wants Lane or Old Six Mile Lane.

Traffic control and signage will be in place to direct road users during this work.

A map of the closure and local road network is printed overleaf.

For the safety of livestock and the community, anyone wishing to move livestock through the area is advised to contact the project team on 1800 679 121 – in advance of any livestock movements – to make arrangements with our contractor, Seymour Whyte.

## How will I be impacted?

The enabling works, which include the upgrading two kilometres of Avenue Road near the site of the new prison and installing a new pipeline from Ulmarra to the site, is progressing. The work will continue until early 2018 and will include:

- Earthworks and drainage
- Constructing road pavement and road surfacing
- Line marking and installing signage
- Installing a new pipe line and remediation work.

The work may be noisy at times, however we will try to minimise the impact on residents where possible.


